

New Military Helmet Has Armor Industry Scrambling

COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO April 23, 2009; Few armor industry mainstays are happy that Decipherst, Inc. has jumped into the helmet market. With the release of each successive independent test result, Decipherst extends its lead over legacy military helmets. The latest tests were performed on March 6, 2009. The unclassified version of the information presents a helmet that stopped five successive shots from an AK-47 rifle, point blank, at full velocity and with sustainable backface deformation. Any armor manufacturer could accomplish this goal if allowed to increase the weight of the helmet, but Decipherst did it and reduced the weight of the current helmet by ½ pound.

The timing of the new developments is auspicious considering the Army and Marines have begun the formal process for testing and purchasing the Enhanced Combat Helmet. The initial documents contain references to classified standards for small-arms protection; a category to which the AK-47 belongs. These contracts indicate initial orders of helmets will be over 200,000. Follow on orders are anticipated to be much larger.

Decipherst is run by Army veterans, who are excited about protecting soldiers and pushing the comfort level of any company not using the state of the art technology to do so.
